

<u>Challenge I</u>

Challenge 2

Read the information on Comparisons and learn how to create similes to describe something.

Re-read Whale Words and list all the similes that are used in the text.

Using My Whale recording sheet or a blank piece of paper to draw or paint on or even make a model (e.g. from playdough)

Create a whale all of your own and invent a name for it (a Backward Whale, a Skinny Whale, a Zig-Zag Whale etc.)

Can you describe your whale using adjectives and similes? Be as creative as you can. I'd love to see your creations.
