

Card 7 - Moon Landing

2019 marks fifty years since humans first walked on the moon. On 16th July, 1969, Apollo 11 was launched into space from the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida. The crew was made up of three astronauts: Neil Armstrong, Michael Collins and Edward "Buzz" Aldrin.



When they landed on the moon, Armstrong and Aldrin prepared themselves for their moon walk. The next day, Armstrong took his first step on the moon and famously said, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." He was soon joined by Aldrin, and the two men began collecting soil and rock samples before planting the American flag. Collins remained in the part of the ship that was orbiting the moon.
