<b>General</b>			
The title reflects what will happen in the story.

Correct usage of past tense.			
Dialogue is included correctly using present tense.			
<b>Introduction</b>			
The main characters are introduced.			
Who, what, when, where and why is established.			
<b>Complication/Problem</b>			
The complication or problem is highlighted.			
The complication involved fantastic, unreal elements that would not usually occur in real life.			
<b>Series of Events</b>			
Events that are triggered are the result of the main problem.			
Events that occur are set out and written in chronological order.			
The events that occur include fantastic, unreal elements that would not usually occur in real life.			
Feelings and emotions responses are made clear through the reactions of the main characters.			
A climax is reached relating to the complication or problem.
